

THE GOSPEL DEMANDS RADICAL URGENCY John 4:27-42

- Jesus does not have an urgent interest in a <u>contest</u> over <u>converts</u> with John the Baptist, nor does He seem interested in a <u>political</u> <u>fight</u>.
- Jesus shows <u>radical disregard</u> for the opinions and <u>predjudices</u> of men.
- His radical urgency for the lost person <u>trumps</u> all our cultural and <u>religious</u> traditions.
 - ▶ Radical urgency does not come from what we know; it only comes from **who we know**.
- Jesus' radical urgency flies in the face of our <u>devotion</u> to our <u>career plans</u> and <u>personal life</u> schedules.
 - **Seeing** with the urgency of the gospel results in **action**.
- This harvest is a **celebration** with **God** Himself.
- We have lives that may appear <u>full</u>, but they are urgently <u>empty</u>!
- The <u>fields</u> don't have any appeal to us because we don't see the <u>reality</u> of the <u>harvest</u>.

Is it <u>four months</u> and then the harvest for us, or is the <u>urgency</u> of Christ in us to <u>pick now</u>?
