THE GOSPEL DEMANDS RADICAL ABANDONMENT Mark 10:17-31

A Radical Approach...

- Jesus' call to salvation demands total **<u>surrender</u>**.
 - Salvation is never a matter of <u>external</u> reformation.
 - Salvation is always a matter of **internal** transformation.
 - Jesus is not merely a respectable **<u>teacher</u>**.
 - Jesus is the sovereign <u>Lord</u>.

A Radical Affection...

Jesus calls us to give sacrificially because He **loves** us.

- He is a Shepherd who protects us.
- He is a Father who **delights** in us.
- He is a King who **provides** for us.

A Radical Command...

Jesus gives commands, not **<u>considerations</u>**.

- As followers of Christ, we do not consider **options**.
- As followers of Christ, we **<u>obey</u>**.

A Radical Reward...

Jesus does not want to strip us of our pleasure; He wants to satisfy us with His **treasure**.

- Which do we want?
 - Short-term treasures we can't keep...
 - Or long-term treasures we can't **lose**?
 - Unpredictable investments...
 - Or inexhaustible <u>savings</u>?
- Where is our heart?
 - Our use of money is a sure barometer of our present spiritual <u>condition</u>.
 - Our use of money is a sure indicator of our future eternal destination.

A Radical Shift...

We must understand our use of money and possessions in the context of biblical **history**.

- In the Past (Old Testament)...
 - Obedience to God led to **<u>acquiring</u>** possessions on earth.
 - God gave possessions to build a **place** that displayed His glory among the nations.
- In the Present (New Testament and Today)...
 - Obedience to God leads us to **abandon** possessions on earth.
 - God gives possessions to build a people who take His glory to the nations.
- In the Future...
 - Obedience to God leads us to **<u>accumulate</u>** possessions in heaven.
 - God gives possessions to build a **paradise** where we will enjoy His glory with the nations.

A Radical Warning...

We desperately need to realize the **<u>deadly</u>** nature of our possessions.

- The danger we face...
 - Riches cause us to become self- **<u>confident</u>**.
 - Riches cause us to become self- **<u>sufficient</u>**.
 - Riches cause us to become self- **<u>centered</u>**.
- The decisions we make...
 - A life of selfish **<u>luxury</u>** that forskes the poor.
 - A life of selfless **love** for the sake of the poor.

A Radical Gift...

Salvation is utterly **impossible** for any and every person apart from the grace of God.

- God **gives** salvation to us.
 - God does not **<u>sell</u>** us salvation.
 - God does not **<u>trade</u>** us salvation.
- God <u>enables</u> sacrifice in us.

A Radical Freedom...

Jesus frees us from our bondage to ourselves and our **<u>stuff</u>**.

- We are free to **go** wherever He calls.
- We are free to give whatever He asks.

A Radical Family...

Jesus unites His people together to enjoy and $\underline{\textbf{encourage}}$ one another as they abandon themselves to Him.

- The **<u>church</u>** no longer seems like an abstract idea.
- **Sacrifice** no longer seems like an appropriate term.
- This **world** no longer seems like an acceptable home.
